# Foreword

The original list is in date order and appears to be a contemporary document. However, the author is, unfortunately, unknown.

It is possible that the author was the vicar of St Leonard's church and Chairman of the Board of Health for Bilston, the Rev. William Leigh, who published in 1833 *An Authentic Narrative Of The Melancholy Occurrences At Bilston ... During The Awful Visitation In That Town By Cholera*. This book contains similar information to that in the list of victims although it does also include further details of several of the victims' circumstances and living conditions.

By the time of the cholera epidemic, the burial ground at St Leonard's church was becoming full so more than 400 of the victims were buried in the churchyard of St Mary's, Bilston and more than 300 were buried in the graveyard of Swan Bank Wesleyan Methodist church.

Where burial details are known, these have been added to this transcript, together with any additional or conflicting information from the church burial register. St Mary's appears to have been a chapel of ease of St Leonard's at the time, so the burials at St Mary's are actually recorded in the St Leonard's burial register. The rector of St Mary's was Mr. Fletcher so where this name is recorded as the vicar in the St Leonard's register, the implication is that the burial actually took place at St Mary's.

Bilston's population in 1831 was 14,492, estimated to have risen to 14,700 by the time of the cholera epidemic. There were 3568 recorded cases of cholera, of which 742 were fatal. These figures were compiled from the Daily Reports made by the surgeons, from the burial registers, the Hospital and Dispensary Records and the details given by the victims' families. The list of victims, however, includes only 692 names.

Although many other places were affected by the Cholera epidemic, the outbreak at Bilston was particularly devastating and an appeal by William Leigh in the Wolverhampton Chronicle for "alms from all who have the means" was copied into London newspapers and brought in funds from all parts of the British isles.
